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Macroeconomic

Macroeconomic Section being the focal point for Vision 2025 and 11th Five Year Plan 2013-18 organized five consultative workshops at provincial capitals and Muzaffarabad to get the input of the provincial governments and to create buy-in for the Vision 2025 at sub-national level. The Provincial Consultative Workshop at Karachi was held on 4th January, 2014 in collaboration with Planning & Development Department, Government of Sindh. While appreciating the inclusive planning mechanism initiative of the Federal Government, the CM termed it beauty of democratic process that two diverse political parties are sitting together for betterment of living standard and development paradigm for the people of Pakistan. He highlighted rich resource endowment of Sindh province such as oil and gas, coal, seaport, industry and strong agriculture base etc. He emphasized the need to develop synergy between federal and provincial government to harness resource potential of the province of Sindh for a better livelihood not only for people of Sindh but Pakistan at large.

Third Consultative Workshop was held in Muzaffarabad, AJK on 20th January and was chaired by Minister

for Planning, Development & reform. President and Prime Minister of AJK, Cabinet, Legislators, Academia and civil society was present at the occasion. Secretary-Finance, Government of AJK presented Vision 2025 for AJK in the light of national vision and Federal Minister Prof. Ahsan Iqbal highlighted the salient features of Vision 2025.

Fourth meeting of the series was held on 23rd January 2014 in the Pearl Continental Hotel Peshawar to get the recommendations of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa government for the preparation of "Pakistan Vision 2025 and 11th Five Year Plan 2013-18". The meeting was organized by the "Governance Support Project" of the Planning & Development Department of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The civil society, academia persons, parliamentarians, and government officers from the province of KP have participated in the workshop. The Federal Minister for Planning, Development & Reform, Prof. Ahsan Iqbal chaired the meeting.

The Balochistan Provincial Consultative Workshop on Pakistan Vision 2025 and 11th Five Year Plan 2013-18 was held at Quetta on 27th January 2014 started with recitation of Holy Quran.

The Minister for Planning, Development and Reform, Prof. Ahsan Iqbal chaired the Workshop while presided by Dr. Abdul Malik, Chief Minister, Balochistan and also attended by Leader of the Opposition in Balochistan Assembly, Federal Secretary, Planning, Development and Reform, Provincial Ministers, Secretaries, Business Leaders, Members of the Academia, Scholars and NGOs representatives.

The Consultative Workshop on "Economic Revival and Growth" was held in Planning Commission on 24th January 2014 to formulate viable plan to steer the economy to higher growth trajectory with job creating ability in a business friendly environment. The representatives of the business community from all over the country participated in the workshop and contributed their valuable input for formulation of economic revival agenda. The recommendations of the workshop will be submitted to the Honourable Prime Minister of Pakistan for consideration at the appropriate level. Poverty Alleviation & MDGs Section

Poverty Alleviation and MDGs Section with the technical assistance of UNDP prepared Pakistan Millennium Development Goals Report 2013. Minister for Planning, Development and Reform chaired the launching ceremony of the Report with Mr. Haoliang Xu, Assistant Secretary General, UNDP, which was held on 22 January 2014 in Planning Commissions' auditorium. Ms. Mariyum Aurangzeb, MNA/Convener of Parliamentary Task Group on MDGs, Mr. Timo Pakkala UN Country Representative and Mr. Marc Andre Franche, Country Director UNDP Pakistan also attended the launching cere-

mony.

The report is the fifth National MDG Report for Pakistan. The report aims to assess progress towards achievement of the MDGs, galvanize for a final push on these, document successes and challenges, and share initial thoughts on the post-2015 development agenda for Pakistan. For the first time, this PMDGR includes a review of sub-national and district level status and trends. The MDGs are a set of 8 goals adopted by 189 countries, including Pakistan in 2000 and to be achieved by 2015. The MDGs provide concrete, numerical benchmarks for tackling extreme poverty in its many dimen-

sions. Pakistan has adopted 16 targets and 41 indicators against which progress is measured and reported. According to the MDG Report 2013, Pakistan is likely to reach to ten of the indicators, while the progress on many others indicate that additional and more focused efforts are needed in order to be able to reach close to these.

Professor Ahsan Iqbal, Federal Minister of Planning, Development & Reform thanked the UN and other development partners for their support in pushing the National development agenda forward and for driving progress on the Millennium Development Goals,

which are in fact Pakistan's National Development Goals. He stressed that had the level of support from the development partners been according to the plan, Pakistan would have performed much better in terms of achieving most of the MDGs. He said MDGs are in reality National Development Goals, which are critical for development of the country. Pakistan 2025 puts human development at the top of development agenda. He underscored the need for collective efforts led by the provincial, regional and federal government together with civil society, academia and other development part-

ners to expedite progress on achieving the MDGs. Haoliang Xu, UN Assistant Secretary General and UNDPs' Director for Asia/Pacific highlighted the setbacks Pakistan has encountered in the form of natural disasters, a deteriorating law and order situation and the global financial crisis in spite of which progress on some MDG indicators has been made. He commended the efforts of the Ministry of Planning, Development and Reform for prioritizing some of these issues in the Vision 2025 and the 11th Five Year Plan and creating synergies and closing links between the policies and strategies at

the national and sub-national level.

Ms. Marriyum Aurangzeb, Parliamentary Secretary for Interior and Narcotics Control and Convener of the Parliamentary Task Force on MDGs elaborated on the objective of the Task Force and the formation of similar groups at the provincial level. These groups have oversight on the implementation of the Millennium Acceleration Framework on Education and Pakistan's Priorities in the Post-2015 Development Agenda, coordinating with the provinces and the national government.



Public Investment Authorization Section

During the reporting period, one meeting of CDWP was held on 16th January 2014 under the Chairmanship of Minister for Planning, Development and Reform/Deputy Chairman, Planning Commission. The forum considered fourteen (14) projects and one (01) concept proposal.

Out of these, six (6) schemes were approved with estimated cost of Rs. 4 billion and five (5) schemes with estimated cost of Rs. 997.781 billion were recommended to the ECNEC for approval being within the competency of the ECNEC. Two schemes were deferred whereas one project

was withdrawn. The proposal for concept clearance was agreed by the august forum.

The priority areas remained the Higher Education, Energy and Water Resources Sector's projects.

- The regular activity regarding estimation of cost of food basket based on minimum (2150 calories) at national and provincial level for the month of January 2014 was carried out which showed that:
 - Cost of food basket during January 2014 decreased by 5% at national, Federal Area & Punjab level, 3% in Sindh and 6% at Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Baluchistan, as compared to December 2013
 - A significant change was found when compared to January 2013 which increased at 8% at National & Federal Level, 7% in Punjab, 10% in Sindh & Baluchistan and 6% in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

Thirty Nine (39) officers from Federal/Provincial Governments and Public Sector Organizations participated.

2. Public Procurement Management from 21 - 24 January 2014

This course was designed to give awareness of all the key

areas required for anyone working within the procurement area and to familiarize the participants with the efficient and transparent system and procedures to ensure that public procurement is conducted competitively and contracts are awarded and managed in a manner that promotes the paramount objective of value for money in government expenditure. Forty two (42) officers from Federal/Provincial Governments and Public Sector Organizations participated.

In the end, Mr. Muhammad Anwar Hussain Ch, Director General, PPMI awarded certificates to the participants.

National Fertilizer Development Centre (NFDC)

Following are the recent major developments/news with respect to fertilizer sector of Pakistan:

- Urea offtake during December 2013 was 674 thousand tonnes, which recorded a decrease of 29.3 percent
- Total fertilizer nutrient

over December 2012 (953 thousand tonnes). DAP offtake was 173 thousand tonnes, which registered an increase of 36.5 per cent as compared to December, 2012 (126 thousand tonnes).

offtake during December 2013 was about 461 thousand tonnes compared to 566 thousand tonnes of December 2012, a decrease of 18.5 per cent. Among all major nutrients offtake of nitrogen and potash fertilizer has

decreased by 25.3 and 49.9 percent respectively, while offtake of phosphatic fertilizers has increased by 29.5 percent.

- Gathered the comments of all relevant stakeholders on the draft summary and report prepared in compliance

of ECC decision in Case No. ECC-123/15/2013, dated: 15th August, 2013. In addition to this, the approval of competent authority (Secretary and Minister for PD&R) was also obtained in respect of final summary and report for ECC.

- NFDC fully contributed in rationalizing / reducing the prices of locally manufactured urea (to a level of Rs. 1,786/- per 50 kg bag) in collaboration with Ministry of National Food Security & Research.
